2021 Data

- 70+ volunteers provided over 5,700 hours of service
- 352 families received financial assistance (rent, utilities, clothing, etc.)
- 51,903 meals were provided to 2,315 families (5,767 people)
- 79 people received assistance with applying or recertifying for SNAP/ESAP (Food Stamps)
